Adding the suffix "-ever" to make compounds from some of the pronouns adds emphasis, to show confusion or surprise.

Demonstrative Pronouns identify or point to nouns.			
this	I will never forget <i>this</i> .		
that	<i>That</i> is incredible!		
these	These are awful!		
those	Those are too heavy.		
such	<i>Such</i> is my belief.		
Determiners adjectivally modify a noun that follows. A sense of relative distance (in time and space) can be conveyed through the choice of these pronouns/ determiners.			
this	<u>This</u> [book in my hand] is well written		
	<u>This</u> is the best you can do?		
that	<u>That</u> [book that I'm pointing to, over there, on the table] is trash.		
these	<u>These</u> [pancakes sitting here now on my plate] are delicious.		
	You're going to wear <u>these</u> ?		

those	<u>Those</u> [pancakes that I had yesterday morning] were even better.		
such
